Our Approach

We strive to spend time with students in their daily lives to connect them to the presence and power of Christ.

We trust that we will be conformed—in our desires, our beliefs, and our practices—to the image of Christ as God's Word dwells in us, as we keep fellowship in the Church, as we pray and receive the sacraments, and as we follow Jesus in obedience.

Participation. The membership and activity of our youth in the life of the church are vital to the flourishing of the whole body. We embrace and lead our youth in the full participation of congregational worship, small groups, and service to others. This participation works on our youth to conform them to the Body of Christ while also fulfilling the participation of the whole congregation.
